LIBRARY FINES REMOVED

Jackson District Library continues to find ways to increase library access for everyone in our community and that's why on September 1 JDL joined thousands of libraries across the country by doing away with overdue fines.

Studies have found that fines do not encourage the on-time return of materials, and contrary to what some may believe, fines don't make the library any significant amount of money either, accounting for less than one-half of one percent of Jackson District Library's annual budget. What fines do is prevent access for patrons who cannot afford to pay those fines, resulting in more materials going unreturned compared with libraries who have removed overdue fines.

JDL patrons are still responsible for returning materials, however. When materials are 30 days overdue, patrons will be charged the replacement cost for them. Accounts with lost/damaged fees totaling \$10 or more will result in the patron's account being blocked until the items are returned or paid for.

BROOKLYN

After eight months of renovations, the Brooklyn Branch is open to the public.

Patrons are welcome to stop by to check out materials and see the space, which includes a footprint twice as large as the original space, a community room, a children's area, and new furniture and shelving.

A grand opening and ribbon cutting is scheduled for Sept. 18 at the branch. Stay tuned for specific information on this exciting event.
